5. Updates from Community Advisory Committee

- 6. Compliance and Improvement Monitoring Activities Leah Davis, Executive Director
 - a. Targeted and Intensive Monitoring Next Steps
 - b. Significant Disproportionality

Those districts in targeted or intensive monitoring should have been in contact with the Technical Assistance advisor. Those in intensive level 1 should have spoken with an Improvement Facilitator. We do not have anyone in level 3 (CDE contact). Districts should be pulling data together, while there has been no direction from CDE. There is some expectation that districts should be showing improvement. If you have any overdue IEPs or assessments. RC SELPAs Data Specialists' will work with districts. Those in Significant Disproportionality that are newly identified should know your assigned SELPA Coordinator. Districts in targeted or intensive will have a policy procedure review. Intensive monitoring -SELPA is working on this for their LEAs. Intensive Level 1 or 2 will provide you with all supporting documents will be given to you. Due to May 30 to CDE. This year there have been a whole host of indicators. Corey Stacy is hosting two sessions of professional development on May 19th. Two sessions will be held twice. One is in person and the other is virtual. Corey is working with CDE on their next pull date. The date was originally scheduled for June 30, push for change. Possible extension to that date.

a. Legislative Highlights

- Legislative Sharing Day. RC SELPA Executive Director got a meeting with the Senate pro Tem
- SB 1113-Ochoa-BoughPassed out of both houses. Set aside money for building out models for inclusion, building supporting inclusive bill.
- 2121-Garcia ADR passed out of both houses. The bill would focus on resource leads and ADR for the state.
- MH Allocation dollars.

b. Fiscal Highlights

Waiting for the Governor's budget to wrap up. SSC is hosting the Governor's May revise on May 20th. Prior to that workshop Coalition to Adequate Funding for SpEd will host a special session for Special Education Administrators. Will share once received.

c. Program Highlights

Talk of IEP teams will be responsible for credentialing mismatch for IEP. The IEP team is responsible for FAPE.

11. Mental Health - Month in Review - ERMHS Team

a. Non-public School Updates

b. WRAP and RTC Updates

This is national Mental Health awareness month. Students continue to struggle with depression and anxiety. The ERMHS team continues to provide MH services; NPS, WRAP and RTC placements. RC SELPA's MH Symposium just concluded. Sommerset is considering construction for the next school year. Riverside county SELPA currently has 15 students placed there. Potential transition to Altus. Childhelp will be consolidating to a K-8 next year.

- NPS-249 students placed
- WRAP-44 students receiving services
- RTC-10 students placed

The public defender's office requested a meeting. They have a grant program, SPARK. They would like to support and partnership and resources for kids. Jeremey will share the Powerpoint. The grant will help staff an additional attorney and social workers in transitional age drop-in centers.

NPS placement is a statewide problem. There are less ptions and many NPS are giving less than a 30-day placement notice. Proposed legislation AB 2508 would like to include more school counselors (pending legislation).

RC SELPA ERMHS staff are presenting at the C5 Institute on June 16-17, 2022. New NPS have been added in San Dimas and La Puente. McKinely was recently added.

12. SELPA System Improvement Leads, CalTAN, and IEP Technical Support and Assistance Update - Leah Davis, Executive Director

Improvement Facilitators are supporting with these grants across the state. Working with LEAs if you are in intensive level 1. Hosting two sessions for mathematic essential strategies.
