7. SELPA Business

7.1. SELPA Personnel Updates

- SEIS Data Specialist-Theresa Turner joins us from VVUSD/HR department.
- Vacant accountant position, open till filled. This position has been vacant since July.

7.2. ERMHS Funding - 2023-24 School Year

2022-23 is a planning year. Next year funds will go directly to the LEAs. The Governance Council was held in person last week. There are currently 3 options available:

- LEA's retain full federal dollars. They would be responsible for NPS/RTC monitoring and visits would pay for full tier 3 services, as well as be responsible for CDE reports, NPS/RTC professional development would fall on the LEA.
- Fee for service model. Charge for professional learning and development, WRAP consult and RTC consult and placement support.
- Status quo-would add language in the allocation plan that districts would send the full federal ERMHS amount to the SELPA.

Will be brought back in October to bring forward in December as an action item. RC SELPA Executive Director has requested an analysis of what the dollar amount would look like.

7.3. Legislative and Fiscal Updates

SB 1113 (Ochoa-Bogh) to develop guidance around inclusion in the state of California.

AB 2121-from the Coachella area specific to ADR. This bill would require at least 3 resource leads to instead be selected in a manner to ensure statewide representation.

AB 2827 (Quirk-Silva) would require the department to revise regulations to permit children with exceptional needs to use outdoor play spaces simultaneously with nondisabled children.

SB 291 advisory commission on Special Education. The bill would increase the number of members on the commission from 17 members to 19 and would require the commission to appoint 2 pupils with exceptional needs.

SB 692 (Cortese) bill requiring the dashboard to include LRE.

SB1016 (Portantino) bill that would require special education to identify fetal alcohol spectrum disorder.

The Governor has till the end of month to sign the bills.

7.4. Alternative Dispute and Learning Recovery Dollars

Check with your fiscal department report (Last two years). 6536 and 5537 what will impact your MOE from next year.

7.5. Independent Study

Legal presentation around it. Legislative priority to advocate for clean-up language.

7.6. Compliance and Improvement Monitoring

Reminders for those in targeted and intensive monitoring are due in the stepwell system November 1st. Districts will be asked to engage in IEP implementation monitoring. In the spring districts will be selected and need to certify the number of students that received at least 95% of their services as indicated on their IEP. CDE will notify Superintendents and SELPAs with a list of students selected for review. LEAs will be required to review 10 % of their pupil count not to exceed 500 students.

8.1. SEACO Update

Student county programs update. Mostly focused on to waive the SEACO next week, new employment, sub reimbursement rate booking at CDE. And CSEA updates.
